Sun Pharma to donate Hostel for Medical College

Baroda, May 12, 2005: In a dignified ceremony in the presence of local dignitaries and university authorities, the H'ble Health Minister, Gujarat, Shri I.K. Jadeja today laid the foundation stone for a medical hostel, which will be sponsored by Sun Pharma. This 48-room hostel will spread over a sprawling 20,000 sq ft is well placed in close vicinity of the Sayaji Hospital campus which offers medical facilities to Baroda and its surrounding areas.
